
WHAT IS THE CHARM PROJECT?

Collaboration to Harmonize Antimicrobial Registry Measures (CHARM) was designed to utilize existing data from partner institution's electronic medical record (EMR) to quantify and assess local antimicrobial prescribing practices. Our hope is to support a community focused on promoting awareness, supporting research, and disseminating best practices surrounding outpatient antibiotic utilization.

How do I get started?

The best way to get started will be to contact one of our core CHARM team members. We will schedule an initial consultation with you to determine the best way to proceed with getting your clinic involved.

How will my data be transferred to CHARM?

Data will be transferred securely from your IT/ HIIM department via OneDrive for Business. This site is maintained behind a Ferris HIPAAcompliant firewall.

How will my data remain secure?

Data will only be stored on the Ferris server, protected by HIPAA-compliant firewall.

What types of results will I recieve?

You have access to our interactive dashboard, where you can apply various filters to get a granular insight into your clinic's antibiotic prescribing practices, adherence to published or institutional guidelines, and performance internal and external to your health system.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Can I compare my data to other health systems?

CHARM has created an anonymous composite dashboard that members can access to benchmark their data against other health systems.

How much does it cost to participate?

Illinois Department of Public Health has partnered with the CHARM team to provide this service at no charge to clinics located in Illinois.

Is there a data use agreement (DUA)?

Our team will provide a DUA template. The CHARM project is monitored by the Ferris State University Institutional Review Board (IRB).

In what ways will I benefit from using the service?

As a participant, you have the ability to generate antibiotic usage reports and disseminate your clinic-specific results. Reports can be used to target and measure effectiveness of stewardship initiatives.
