

IHIPC/ IDPH Responsibilities

- Participate in an HIV planning/public advisory process, representing and advocating for the HIV prevention, care, and treatment needs of people living with HIV and communities and populations at risk for HIV infection, particularly those disproportionately affected in Illinois.
- Develop and monitor the HIV planning and community engagement process to ensure a coordinated, collaborative approach to planning HIV prevention, care, and treatment services for the highest risk populations in Illinois.
- Participate in development of the Statewide Coordinated Statement of Need for HIV care and prevention, involving multiple key community stakeholders.
- Inform the development and update of the *Illinois Integrated Plan for HIV Prevention and Care*.
- Review and assess the State's Integrated Plan to ensure it demonstrates a collaborative and coordinated approach for HIV prevention, care, and treatment and ensures that prevention, care, and treatment services and resources are directed to the areas with the greatest HIV disease burden.

OUR MISSION:

“Reduce the number of new HIV infections, increase access to HIV care and improve health outcomes for people living with HIV, reduce HIV-related health inequities and disparities, and serve as a role model and central advisory body for HIV prevention and care planning activities throughout the State of Illinois.”

IHIPC MEMBERSHIP:

- Thirty-five (35) voting members
- Twenty-seven (27) elected and 8 appointed
- Represent all IL regions
- Represent people living with HIV and all HIV-affected populations and transmission groups
- Represent diverse demographics, cultures, ages, professions, and experiences
- Some are HIV+; some are not.
- Approximately 15 non-voting IDPH staff-support members
- Many other community stakeholders
- Voting members and IDPH staff support are assigned to at least one IHIPC Committee.
- Other community members may participate on IHIPC committees.

WHY COMMUNITY PLANNING:

- With community planning, those affected by HIV and those with experience and expertise in the HIV field help determine the scope, depth and content of HIV prevention, care, and treatment programming in Illinois.
- Services are successful when they reach people where they are in their lives, not where others think they ought to be.
