

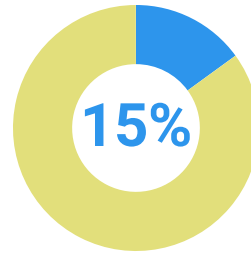

## What are Health Inequities?

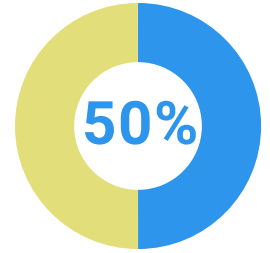

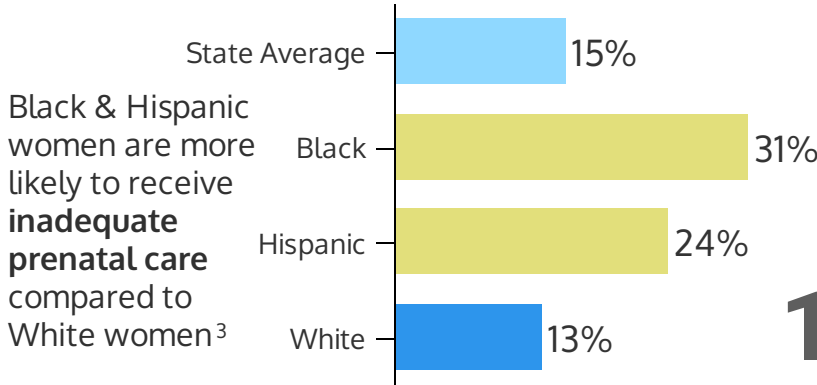
### African Americans =



Of Illinois Population

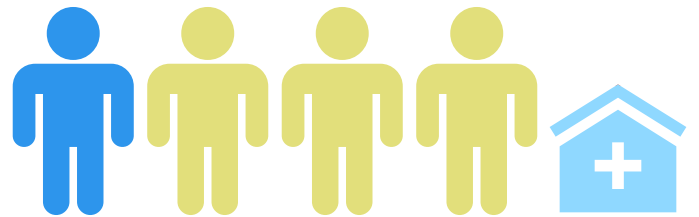
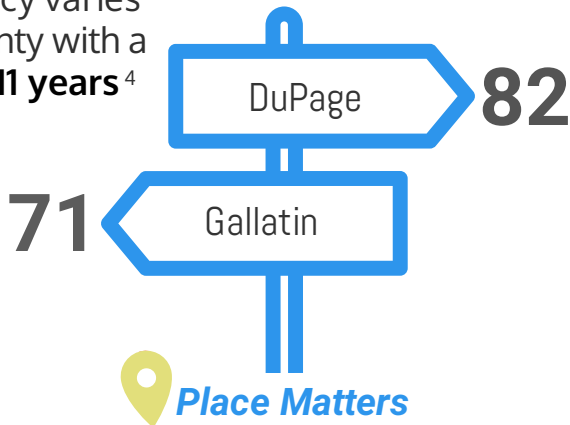


Of new HIV/AIDS cases diagnosed since 2008<sup>1</sup>
