THEREFORE, I, JB Pritzker, Governor of the State of Illinois, do hereby proclaim November 18, 2021, to be **Illinois Rural Health Day** in honor of National Rural Health Day, and encourage Illinois residents to celebrate the unique contributions and selflessness of our rural healthcare providers.
